Even if you have expressed to the GI Staff your desire to be a second year intern, we still need a complete application from each individual. Please note that applications received after May 15, 2009 will be subject to a \$50 processing fee. Applications received after July 17, 2009 will be subject to a \$100 application fee. **Please take note of the changes to the down payment procedures for both tuition and dorm housing as they may be different than last year.**

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THE STRATEGY

Generation Interns is a three-year training program holding to a progressive training strategy, each year building upon the foundation of the previous year.

First Year

The first year is a time to lay a solid foundation in the Word of God and successful Christian living. It is an opportunity to be exposed to a wide array of training opportunities within the local church. As a first year Intern, you will have the opportunity to participate in various ministry tracks, service opportunities at all of The City Church campuses and participate in a local or international mission trip.

Second Year

The second year builds upon the first with more specific teaching and increased leadership responsibility. As a second year Intern, you will be developing your leadership as a point person in one of our ministry tracks. You will also assist in leadership roles within Generation Church cadres, service at The City Church campuses, and mentoring first year interns. You will also participate in a local or international mission trip.

Ministry Apprenticeship

A Ministry Apprenticeship involves the placement and commissioning of our Interns into our network of affiliate ministries for continued training and leadership development. Generation Interns that are approved by the Board of Elders of The City Church will be sent to satellite churches, partnering ministries within the United States and various international locations. You will be used to strengthen our churches and in some cases assist in the establishment of affiliate Internships.

Credit Courses

The core classes offered at Generation Interns are Portland Bible College extension courses taught locally by our instructors. Interns who complete the classes will receive PBC degree credits. PBC has religious exempt status in Oregon and Washington and grants religious degrees to its graduates. 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INTERNSHIP EXPECTATIONS

I Timothy 4:12 “Let no one despise your youth, but be an example to the believers in word, in conduct, in love, in spirit, in faith, in purity.” As a Generation Intern you are to be an example in your speech, your lifestyle, your love for God and others, your attitude of faith, and in your moral purity.

Pledge Of Honor | The Pledge of Honor outlines character choices and disciplines consistent with the lifestyle of a Generation Intern at The City Church. The framework for these expectations is explained in further detail in the Pledge of Honor form on page 10 of this brochure and include: Intimacy, Character, Authority, Study, Stewardship, Health, Faithfulness, Purity, Fellowship, Leadership, Focus, and Excellence.

Relationships | This season, as a Generation Intern, is dedicated for the development of intimacy with God and His Word. We ask our interns to set this time aside and focus on your training. Keeping this focus will maintain the integrity of this program and provide you with the full benefit of what this program was designed to produce.

Employment | We realize that as a Generation Intern you may desire to pursue some type of part-time employment in order to meet your expenses. Because of your commitment to Generation Interns, we require that you limit your part-time workweek to 20 hours or less.

Ministry Trips | One of the vital parts of your training as a Generation Intern will come through participation in one of our ministry trips. These trips vary in location and duration each year. There are both national and international opportunities provided as the Lord directs. A percentage of your tuition is allocated for trip expenses, primarily the airfare. Depending upon the specifics for each trip, there may be additional expenses that you will be responsible for in order to participate. Detailed mission trip information will be sent to you upon acceptance into the program.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Certificates of Completion will be awarded to Interns who have successfully completed the course set before them in the following areas:

Instruction Standards You must complete all assignments and worksheets on time and maintain at least a 78% average for credit courses.

Ministry Standards You must receive above average ratings in your Ministry Tracks, based on promptness, attendance, performance of tasks, attitude and the completion of a ministry track journal.

Mentoring Standards You must maintain consistent attendance and leadership in a cadre (small group through Generation Church or Young Professionals Ministry).

Attendance Standards You cannot acquire more than three unexcused absences per semester. (Excused absences include: The City Church Mission Trips & Outreaches and pre-arranged excused personal absences.)

Financial Standards You must be current on your financial obligations each month and be paid in full at the time of graduation. Intern financial obligations include: tuition, mission trip payments and dorm rent (if applicable).

DISCIPLINARY PROCESS

To maintain the standards and integrity of the Generation Interns program, if any of the guidelines, pledges or standards are violated, the Generation Interns director or his designee will take corrective action as determined in such person's discretion. While some violations may require immediate dismissal or other corrective actions, generally the Intern will be given a warning and placed on a fifteen-day probationary period. If the director or his designee determines there is no measurable change in the Intern or that the required steps have not been taken by the Intern during the probation, the Intern will be dismissed. Dismissal may be immediate, at the end of the current semester, or at another time determined by the director or his designee.

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HOUSING

If you are interested in obtaining housing at the Plateau Campus Dorms, you will need to complete the Housing Request Form included in the application. More information on housing is available on the intern website at www.generationinterns.org. Our housing handbook, which explains amenities, standards and expectations is also available online. Intern housing is currently \$250/month (does not include food or transportation costs), which is in addition to tuition. Upon acceptance into the Intern program, the finance department will mail an invoice for tuition and rent down payments. **A \$525 housing deposit is due by August 28 in order to secure dorm housing (includes a \$75 damage deposit, prorated rent for September 2009, and rent for May 2010). The \$525 housing deposit should be mailed with appropriate documentation upon acceptance to: The City Church, Finance Dept, 9051 132nd Ave NE, Kirkland, WA 98033.** Monthly rent payments are due on the 1st of each month, beginning in October and culminating in April. Rent for any month(s) may be paid in advance of the date that it is due. Payments received after the 10th of the month will be subject to a 5% late fee.

FINANCES

Tuition for Generation Interns is \$4,800 per year per student. This does not include the cost of housing. The tuition covers all books, materials, manuals, conference fees and a portion of your ministry trip. **An additional fee will be added to tuition for food service at the dorms. The cost for meal plans is still pending; additional information will be available soon.**

Upon acceptance into the Intern program, the finance department will mail an invoice for the required down payment, along with forms to complete. Interns are required to pay a minimum down payment (\$500 immediately non-refundable) no later than Friday, August 28, 2009 (down payment price still pending). **Please remit down payment with appropriate documentation to: The City Church, Finance Dept, 9051 132nd Ave NE, Kirkland, WA 98033.** (Initial payment may be cashier's check, money order, or credit card— No personal checks will be accepted for down payment and please do not mail cash.) The remaining balance will be divided into monthly installments for each semester. Monthly minimum payments are due on the 1st of each month and begin in October. Payments received after the 10th of the month will be subject to a late fee (5%of outstanding balance). The tuition for any semester may be paid in full at any point throughout the program.

Financial Preparedness

Financial preparedness is a key factor in determining whether this is the right time for you to be a Generation Intern. We want you to be free from excessive financial debt during your time as an Intern. Acceptance into the program is contingent upon your ability to faithfully handle your financial obligations as a Generation Intern.

Financial Stewardship

Financial stewardship is a key factor in maintaining your place as a Generation Intern. Falling behind in monthly installments will jeopardize your status as an Intern and could result in early dismissal from Generation Interns.

Acceptance into Generation Interns will be determined by your application portfolio, references, an interview and the prayerful decision of our pastoral team. Please note: Applications submitted for Generation Interns will also be reviewed by and subject to approval of Portland Bible College since our academic courses receive PBC credits.

TIMING

Three main factors contribute toward determining whether this is the right time for you to be a Generation Intern.

- 1. Spiritual Authority** We want to know that the spiritual authorities in your life (parents, pastors, & mentors) all agree that this is the right training environment for you at this time.
- 2. Personal Life** Spiritual maturity and preparedness are key factors in determining entrance into this program. In order to be considered for acceptance, your commitment to spiritual disciplines and involvement in a local church over the past six months will be examined.
- 3. Finances** You must demonstrate financial stability in order to be considered as a Generation Intern. Interns are not permitted to work full time jobs. Interns may work part time (limited to 20 hours per week) as long as it does not interfere with the Generation Intern schedule.

Step One Submit all of the following materials in a portfolio to the Generation Intern offices prior to July 17, 2009. **Application review will commence once all materials are received.**

1. Fill out application completely. Please take the time to read and complete all questions and denoted fields. It is not necessary to submit the informational pages of this brochure (pages 1-6) with your application.
2. Fill out Housing Request Form (if necessary).
3. Have your Pastor or Cadre leader complete the Pastoral Recommendation Form. Have them return it to you in a sealed envelope or mail it directly to our offices. Other reference forms, emails or phone calls do not replace this form.
4. Have your prospective Ministry track leader complete the Ministry Track form (multiple references may be submitted if you are uncertain which track you would like to be a part of).
5. Include the \$50 registration fee (Please make checks payable to The City Church - do not mail cash). Applications received after July 17, 2009 will be subject to an additional \$50 late processing fee. **The \$50 registration fee will be waived if applications (complete with all forms) are received prior to May 15, 2009.**
6. **Mail the above items (or drop off at The City Church) postmarked by July 17, 2009 to: The City Church Plateau campus, Generation Interns, 4221 228th Ave SE STE A, Issaquah, WA 98029.** Please contact our offices for questions regarding late application procedure.

Step Two Apply for a passport at your local post office (or online) if you do not already have one. This will enable you to travel internationally during the year and must be completed before orientation day. Please note that the new travel regulations recently implemented for US travelers have created extensive waiting periods for new passport applications to be fully processed. It would be to your advantage to process a passport as soon as possible in order to ensure that you would be able to participate in the Generation Intern mission trips.

Step Three Once all materials have been received and reviewed by the Generation Intern staff, we will contact you for a personal interview. For applicants who live in the Northwest, we require an "in-person" interview. Out of state/ country applicants will be permitted to hold a phone interview. Our staff will prayerfully consider each applicant before a decision is made regarding your application.

Step Four Once acceptance has been determined, we will contact you and mail you an acceptance packet with further information and instructions. We will also mail you an invoice for the required down payments, along with tuition and housing forms (if necessary) for you to complete and return to us. **Tuition and housing down payments must be received with their corresponding forms prior to Friday, August 28, 2009 to: The City Church, Finance Department, 9051 132nd Ave NE, Kirkland, WA 98033.**

Step Five Intern registration commences on Friday, September 11, 2009 (Details will be included with acceptance packet). Parents are invited to attend this first weekend of activities.
